70DL Tile Plow Type Setup Instructions

- 1) Check the machine to make sure the walking tandems are facing away from the plow assembly. If not:
 - a. Place a jack under the main frame assembly close to one side and jack the machine up until the wheels are off the ground.
 - b. Place a jack stand to secure the machine while in the air.
 - c. Attach a chain to the hook point on the Walking Tandem and a skid steer, forklift or loader.
 - d. Remove the bolt from the Walking Tandem Collar Assembly.
 - e. Remove the Walking Tandem Collar.
 - f. Slide the Walking Tandem off the axle and turn around.
 - g. Slide back onto the axle, place the Walking Tandem Collar on the axle.
 - h. Place bolt through hole and tighten nut.
 - i. Remove chain and lower machine.
 - j. Repeat on other side if needed.
- 2) Check the air pressure in the tires, it should be 70 psi.
- 3) Set the tongue parallel to the ground, using the Bullpull Bushing, moving the Bullpull up or down if needed, and shim the Bull Pull Hitch tight in the clevis of the tractor.
 - a. You must use the provided spacer in the top of the Bullpull Hitch. Failure to do so voids warranty on the Bullpull.
- 4) Set the Depth Gauge
 - a. Lower the shank to the ground
 - b. Move the depth gauge so the pointer is aligned with the GROUND when viewing from the tractor.
- 5) Set the Pitch Gauge
 - a. Place a magnetic protractor on the ground, not the degrees from 90 degrees.
 - b. Place a 4" x 4" block under the heel of the shank.
 - c. Lower the shank onto the block until the plow transfers weight onto the hitch of the tractor.
 - d. Place the magnetic protractor onto the back of the shank.
 - e. Extend or retract the slope bylinders until the magnetic protractor reads the same degrees as the walking tandems.
 - f. Move the pitch gauge so it reads 90 degrees from the tractor.
- 6) Attach the proper sized Quick Attach Trailing Boot. 4" boot for 3" or 4" tile, 6" boot for 5" or 6" tile, 8" boot for 8" tile, 10" boot for 10" tile or 12" boot for 12" tile.

70DL Tile Plow - Operating Instructions

- 1) Dig a Start Hole at the discharge point of the tile line.
- 2) Back up to and lower shank into start hole.
- 3) Change the slope so the pitch gauge reads 90 degrees.
- 4) Lower to desired depth and feed tile through and out of the bottom of the Quick Attach Trailing Boot.
- 5) Pull the plow into the beginning of the run until the soil is almost to the back of the shank.
- 6) Connect tile to main or lay it at the discharge point if not using a main.
- 7) Have someone hold the tile for the first 15-20 feet of the tile run and then the ground will hold the tile.
- 8) Start driving forward, optimal tiling speed is 0.8-1.25 miles per hour.
- 9) Use the hydraulics on the plow to raise or lower the plow to maintain the proper grade. GPS or Laser Grade control is preferable.
- 10) If conducting a pre-rip, start plow higher than tile discharges, do not go any closer than 6 inches where you want to lay your tile.
- 11) If a second pull machine is required, connect a log chain, cable, or tow rope to the tow hook on the tongue of the tile plow.
- 12) The proper size Quick Attach Trailing Boot should be used for laying tile.
 - a. 4" Quick Attach Trailing Boot for 3" and 4" tile
 - b. 6" Quick Attach Trailing Boot for 5" and 6" tile
 - c. 8" Quick Attach Trailing Boot for 8" tile
 - d. 10" Quick Attach Trailing Boot for 10" tile
 - e. 12" Quick Attach Trailing Boot for 12" tile
- 13) To change the Quick Attach Trailing Boot
 - a. Attach a chain to a skid steer or loader and to the loop at the top of the boot.
 - b. Pull the upper pin connecting the Quick Attach Trailing Boot to the plow.
 - c. Lift the Quick Attach Trailing Boot away.
 - d. Attach the chain to the desired Quick Attach Trailing Boot and lift into place.
 - e. Slide lower pin into hole.
 - f. Lift bottom of Quick Attach Trailing Boot to line up hole for upper pin.
 - g. Slide in upper pin and attach safety clip.
 - h. Remove 8 bolts from wear plate and lift plate away.
 - i. Place desired wear plate on the front of the shoe and attach with the 8 bolts.
